How to reach a pharmacist

A pharmacist is available during normal business hours to provide information about our programs as well as medication and disease information. We also have a pharmacist on call after hours for urgent needs.

When to contact the pharmacy

- When you have questions about your medication or disease
- To check the status of your order, including information about delays
- To find out where to obtain drugs not available from Avera Compounding Pharmacy
- To find out about getting medications during an emergency or disaster
- To order medications that are needed while you travel
- To discuss prescription transfers from another pharmacy
- If you believe you have received a medication in error
- If you have questions about a medication recall

Orders and Refills

New prescription

Call the Avera Compounding Pharmacy or simply ask your physician to phone, fax or e-prescribe your prescription to our pharmacy.

Refill prescription

Due to the specialized nature of compounded medications, they require additional time to prepare. Please contact us at least 7 days ahead of running out to have your medications refilled. Have the prescription number and/or name of the medication available.

Transfer prescription

Call the Avera Compounding Pharmacy with the name of the medication you'd like to transfer and the name of the pharmacy you'd like it transferred from and we will do the rest.

Order status

Call the Avera Compounding Pharmacy and our staff can tell you the status of your prescription.

Mail out

We will ship your medication and supplements through priority mail with the U.S. Postal Service at no extra charge. If you will be traveling away from home, please check with us ahead of time as we are not able to ship medications into states in which we are not licensed.

Additional Information You Should Know

In the event of an emergency, contact your local emergency medical services (EMS) or 911.

- If you believe you are experiencing an adverse drug reaction please contact us, your physician, or poison control (800-222-1222) immediately; or, if severe, dial 911.
- Confidentiality of your health care information is very important to us. Our staff will keep your records and information strictly confidential according to all state and federal rules and regulations. Your information will only be made available to those that have a legal right to your information or others that you designate in writing.
- Complaints and grievances: We put our patients first when it comes to customer service, satisfaction and safety. Please contact us if something is unclear about our service or your treatment. All concerns and complaints will be fully documented, investigated and resolved to the best of our ability within 24 to 48 business hours.
